

#### MAKE OUR MEALS-TO-GO A COMMUNAL EXPERIENCE

We believe community is built when people gather around a table. Faced with the ongoing reality that our meals need to be distributed outdoors and to-go, how do we nurture this core value of The Dale? It begins with inviting a community member to be the one who hands out the meals whenever possible, having staff stand in the line-up to greet people, and encouraging people to linger, connect and converse.

## Re-LAUNCH INDOOR PROGRAMMING

In 2020 all of our partner buildings shut down to us due to the pandemic, with the exception of one. In 2022 we began the slow work of finding partners ready to host indoor programming. In September St. Francis Table re-opened their doors to us, enabling us to re-launch our evening Bible Study. This group is is open to anyone. We collectively agree to actively listen to one another and welcome questions of all kinds.

#### ENGAGE IN MEANINGFUL ADVOCACY

The issues surrounding poverty can be overwhelming. In an effort to support and defend people who do not have access to affordable housing, The Dale promoted and attended a National Day of Housing rally, occasionally prayed silently outside City Hall, attended a Silent Prayer Vigil, signed petitions, wrote letters, and stood alongside community members facing eviction.

We will come to you, whether it be because you are housebound, in hospital, or simply need a friendly visit.

> We offer support in getting to important appointments, including help with transportation.

We will pick up prescriptions, run general errands and do grocery shopping.

Many people have pets who function as family. We will feed and walk pet when needed. We also help get sick animals to the veterinarian. In some cases we help with end of life care.

We visit and support people who live outdoors. We provide tents, sleeping bags, blankets, fire extinguishers, socks, and food.

For the first time since the onset of the pandemic, The Dale was able to hold indoor Memorial Services for our community members who died in 2022.

Together with The Parkdale Musicians Collective, The Dale held the second Annual "Spirits in the Sky" event, a gathering to honour and remember the comrades we have lost over the years.

Erinn attended and spoke at Inhabit, the flagship conference of the Parish Collective in Seattle.

We held art activities in the Milky Way Garden and at Church of the Epiphany and St. Mark, a move toward more post-Covid programming.

Blythwood Road Baptist Church funded our Christmas meal, which was cooked by a team of volunteer chefs, and then organized by Christ Church St. James- a wonderful group effort.

The Dale and Silver Haven Retreat began a new partnership, one that enables us to send people to a beautiful cottage for respite out of the city.

We had a wedding at The Dale! Congratulations to Eddie and Tasha!

A large group from Scarborough Community Alliance Church came to The Dale with hot meals and drinks, and very substantial care packages. Our community was thrilled.

The Dale hosted Overdose Prevention and Naloxone Training twice, facilitated by Aaron Woznica from Parkdale Queen West Community Health Centre.

The Meeting House funded and participated in a Winter Boot Clinic for the community.

For the the first time since 2019, The Dale was able to go Christmas Carolling through the neighbourhood.

The staff team attended a rally for the National Day of Housing on November 22nd.


